The Contact

Every once in a while there comes in life those “Aha!” or “Oh ya” moments, when things seem to fall in place again and you are able to say, “So that’s what this is all about. I knew that!” One of those moments for me came as I stood before Bishop Hougen on June 27 to affirm my ordination vows. Since attending ordinations is something I do very infrequently, (I’m not sure, but my own may have been the last one) it was interesting to hear again what I had promised to do some twenty-five years ago. I hope it brought new focus to my work as a pastor.

“Will you assume this office, believing that the Church’s call is God’s call to the ministry of word and sacrament?”

“Will you preach and teach in accordance with the Holy Scriptures and the creeds and confessions of the church?”

“Will you be diligent in your study of the Holy Scriptures and in your use of the means of grace? Will you pray for God’s people, nourish them with the Word and Holy Sacraments, and lead them by your own example in faithful service and holy living?”

“Will you give faithful witness in the world, that God’s love may be known in all that you do?”

A review of these questions reminds me to “keep the main thing the main thing.” They remind me that the focus of my work needs to be Word and Sacrament, Scripture and Confessions, prayer and the means of grace, faithful service and witness in the world. These are the things I am called to care about and tend to; and these are also the things which the whole Church and we as a congregation are to care about and tend to. In an age where all kinds of other expectations are piled layer upon layer on the church and those who serve in it, it is essential that we keep our eyes focused on our calling, to not lose track of what for the church is “the main thing.”

Next month, a look at our confirmation vows and the promises made for faithful Christian living.

Pastor Ostrem

I have now been back from South Dakota for two days. I must say that the older I get, the longer it takes to recuperate. I am still yawning but I wouldn’t have given up going for anything. It was a great trip and all of the parents and members of Zion should be really proud of their youth. It is great to know that the youth are supported in these kinds of endeavors.

Our time together on the bus was fun and entertaining. We saw about 6 movies (Shrek twice!) and found out that sleeping in a bus seat can be a challenge. We loved Wall Drug and the breakfast there was great. We expanded our perceptions at Cosmos and then enjoyed Mt. Rushmore and Crazy Horse Mountain. Tina Moore became the “Deli Chef” by putting together, on the bus, sandwich orders in record time.

Upon arrival, I spent my time with the Middle School youth, and so I am much more familiar with that part of the experience. Our first challenge was walking the mile to the Fort. All of us missed the familiar—family, running water, flush toilets, electricity, food cooked in/on a stove or microwave. However, we couldn’t help but catch some of the enthusiasm of the counselors. Shower day was Wednesday. Can you imagine??? One shower all week and that was a one minute shower. The splash of water was a renewing experience and made me think of my baptism.

We were surrounded by beautiful scenery—rock outcroppings and wonderful ponderosa pines. The youth went horse back riding and even hiked to the top of a mountain to get a spectacular view of the area.

The mountain top experience didn’t end with our leaving. I believe that the youth will never forget their time at Atlantic Mountain Ranch. I returned thinking of all that we have and all that we, all too often, take for granted. It may be family or friends, or it may be those everyday conveniences. Our faith was challenged and grew. I am still singing the songs from the campfires and so the journey continues.

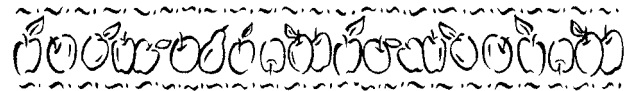

New Banner

If you have attended a baptism or a funeral at Zion in the past month, you may have noticed a new Baptism/Funeral banner which will be displayed at all baptisms and funerals in the future. This banner comes as a gift in memory of George Schmidt.

Unique to Zion and designed and made by Jeanette Paulson, a liturgical artist from Duluth, MN, the banner features at the center the traditional descending dove, symbol of the Holy Spirit given at baptism. At the top of the banner are diamonds with a cross in each, suggestive of God's heavenly rooms awaiting us at our death. Below are water droplets of baptism falling into the River of Life.

The banner, along with other symbols currently in use in the congregation including the baptismal garment, the Christ candle, and the funeral pall, ties together the events of baptism and funeral, for as we read in Romans 6:3-5: *"Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his."*

The new banner is also being used as the art work on the new baptismal certificates recently designed for our congregation.

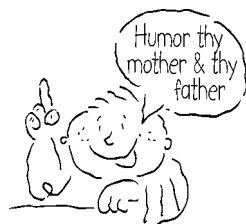

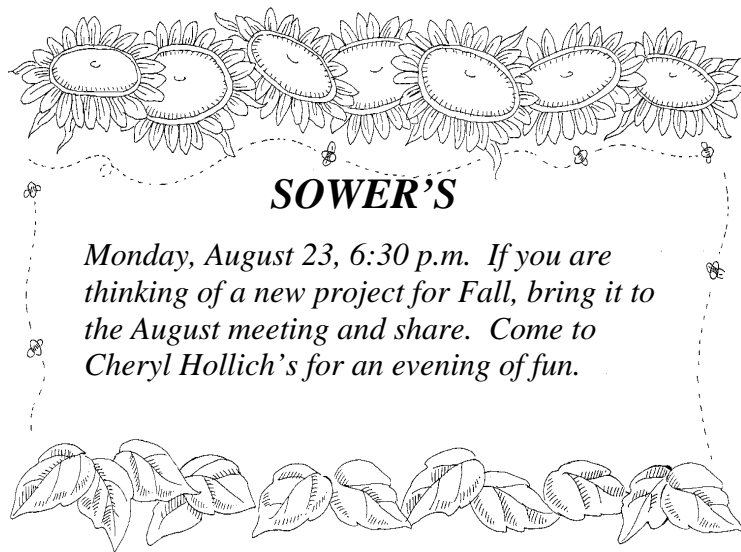

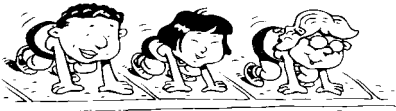
