“Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism:

*to live among God’s faithful people,
to hear his Word and share in his supper,
to proclaim the good news of God in Christ
through word and deed,
to serve all people following the example of
our Lord Jesus Christ,
and to strive for justice and peace in all the
earth?”*

I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

Such is the promise made at confirmation. I see two basic parts to it, parts similar to the two parts of the Ten Commandments. First there is a promise to be attentive to one’s relationship with God. Those who make a confirmation vow promise to be a part of the Christian community called the Church, to be faithful in hearing the Word proclaimed at worship each week and to frequently receive the sacrament of Holy Communion. Sometimes people ask me, “Can you be a Christian without going to worship?” For those who have made a promise like that made in confirmation, that simply is never the question. We have promised not even to try doing that. The confirmation vow recognizes that faith grows and is nurtured as one attends to one’s relationship to God through worship.

The other part of the promise has to do with being attentive to one’s relationship with one’s neighbors. Part of what it means to live in relationship to God is to live in a way that shares the love of God with those around us, which serves others like Jesus served, and which strives for that which is just and that which makes peace in our world.

Jesus said that the will of God for our lives is summed up in this brief phrase: **Love God and love neighbor.** Through baptism God calls us into this relationship and this mission. Any time we affirm our faith we promise to live in this way. We keep our promises in two simple ways: Worship of God and service to neighbors.

I can’t believe that it is going to be September already. It seems that summer just began and the prospects of VBS and the Youth Trip were right around the corner. Now they are past and it is time to think of Confirmation, Sunday School, 3rd Grade Bible classes, Sauerkraut Dinner, etc. Since Fall is my favorite time of year, I am not complaining... just marveling over the fact that time goes by so quickly.

I’ve mentioned before (in my sermon!) the fact that the evangelism strategy that was adopted by the last Churchwide Assembly included prayer. It is no coincidence that you are hearing a lot about prayer around Zion. In past articles, I have mentioned the different prayer forms that I have been introduced to through my Spiritual Formation Continuing Education program. Then there is:

- Confirmation begins on September 1. Our first course of study will be the Lord’s Prayer. Both the Middle School and High School classes will begin the year with a study of prayer.
- On Rally Sunday, September 12, the theme for the day will be “*Hear Our Prayer.*” The children will be practicing a variety of prayer forms—the prayer wall, a prayer chain, prayer flames, prayer partners, and much more.
- Friendship Sunday is September 26 and the theme is *Pray, Invite, Encourage.* Once again you are asked to think about someone in your life who has no church home and invite them to Zion.

Along with all of the activities and studies comes a marvelous tool that I urge all of you to look at and use. The ELCA has a part of their website devoted just to prayer. It is www.elca.org/prayer. It contains resources that include: a call to prayer, ways to pray, prayer in congregations, good reading on prayer, and daily devotions (including a meditation). Each of those topics has many ideas and resources under them for your use. Check it out and let me know what you think. In the meantime, remember to pray for each other.

CROP WALK OCTOBER 3, 2004

The 33rd ANNUAL CROP WALK FOR HUNGER will be held October 3, 2004 at 2:00 p.m. in Muscatine. It will start again at First National Bank's underground parking lot for only a 5K walk this year. The walk will be held on the river walk with a break at Musser Park if needed and then return to the bank.

This is an excellent way to help stop hunger worldwide through Church World Service and locally, since 25% of all proceeds will stay at the Muscatine Community Food Pantry. Once again this year, E & M Charities, now the New Hope Foundation, will be matching the pledges obtained by the walkers. This means the amount obtained by each walker in pledges will be doubled!

Last year, the Muscatine CROP WALK contributed over \$35,000 (including the matching grant). Zion contributed around \$2000 and with matching funds that came to \$4000 with \$1000 staying in Muscatine. This ends up being the largest fund raiser for the food pantry. What a great response from our Congregation last year. Let's continue to show we care.

Sign up to walk or pledge after the Worship Services on September 19 or 26 or call Nancy Tietge at 263-0032. Pledges need to be in and envelopes returned to Nancy or other designee at either Worship Service or before the walk on Sunday, October 3. Sign up to walk as an individual, family, pal, or group, but sign up to walk and support this needy cause.

Why do we do this? 20% of the world's population lives in absolute poverty with incomes of less than a dollar a day. People are still starving. One U.S. child in five lives in poverty. We can't help ALL, but we can do SOMETHING. Remember, we will be helping some of the hungry in Muscatine County by putting money in the Muscatine Food Pantry and this is important for helping our own neighbors in Muscatine.

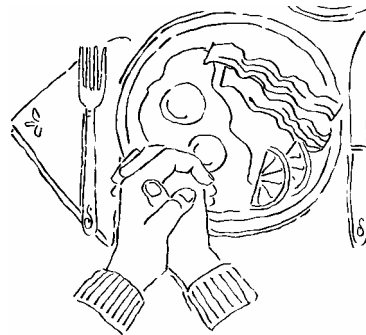
