# TEAMWORK

Several articles in this month's issue of the newsletter deal with information regarding our Trust Fund. This fund, created about fourteen years ago continues to be a great blessing to our congregation and community. It is hard to believe that over twenty young people have benefited from scholarships made possible by this fund. Two more will be presented this year. Human service groups and various ministries have benefited from grants made by our mission outreach fund. Students at Wartburg Seminary have benefited from funds for scholarships. Other funds support youth ministry and other work in our congregation. We are only scratching the surface of the potential for opportunities this fund presents to us.

That is why I am excited about the "LEAVE A LEGACY" seminar being jointly sponsored by our Trust Fund and Stewardship committees on Sunday, October 24. Our presenter, Pastor Bob Buschkemper, comes to us through a service provided to congregations such as ours by the ELCA Foundation. He has career experience as a parish pastor, a stock broker, and now a consultant for financial planning and deferred gifts for ELCA congregations and members. He comes to educate and inform. He will be available for those who would like to discuss further some of the things he shares with us.

The future ministry and outreach of Zion Lutheran Church can be greatly enhanced by the growth of our Trust Fund. We have seen small but steady growth in this fund over the years. Planning for gifts to this fund both for now and in the future will further strengthen our outreach and mission.

Plan now to attend the seminar which will follow a catered meal at noon on Sunday, October 24. Remember the Trust Fund when making plans for your estate or when making memorials for friends or loved ones. No gift is insignificant. Because the fund spends only the interest from investments, each gift builds a lasting legacy which will benefit God's people for many years into the future.

I was recently reading the book, The Christian's Calling in the World by Marc Kolden. This is the book that you will be able to read (only 50 pgs!!) and discuss in our Graciously Called, Graciously Sent small groups during Lent. Marc Kolden begins early in the book by talking about *creation* and that the Christian doctrine of creation says that nothing exists with which God is not involved.

The seasons of Spring and Fall always make me more aware of God's hand in creation. It's probably the bursting forth of plants and color after the bleakness of winter or later, it's probably the changing of green to bright reds, yellows, and oranges. I am profoundly impacted by the colors and beauty of God's pallet.

What impacted me even more were Kolden's later words: "The Bible says that not only did God create in the beginning and that in every moment God is creating, that each of us and everything in the world depends upon God continually creating and preserving or we and everything else would cease to be. Martin Luther knew this: in his Catechism he speaks of the God who 'created and still *preserves* my eyes and ears and all my powers' and who 'daily provides abundantly' for all the needs of my life."

I also reread Psalm 104 and discovered that the whole Psalm is about God's creative work and most of the verbs—the action words—are in the *present* tense. Things fit together because God watches over creation. We are a part of that creation. We are always part of that action in the present tense.

Marc Kolden also quoted a famous preacher who once said "you can tell if God is working in your life if your nose works!" They say he got that from Psalm 104. So.....go get your Bible and re-read Psalm 104 and see what you think.

In your daily life remember to "Bless the Lord!"

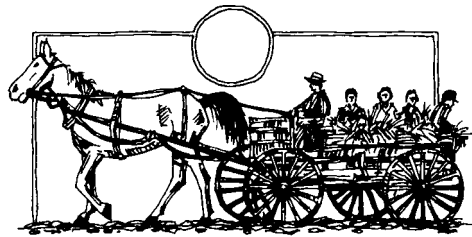

## PRAYER VIGIL

*"Let my prayer rise

Last June the Southeastern Iowa Synod passed a resolution encouraging congregations to join together in a prayer vigil on All Saints Sunday, November 7. The vigil will be held from 6:00 AM to 6:00 PM in congregations throughout the Synod. Zion is planning on participating and the Vigil will be held in the Lounge.

We will be praying, in fifteen minutes segments, for the renewal of the church. A resource for prayer and meditation will be made available for participant use. All members of Zion are being asked to consider signing up for one or more time segments so that we can fill the entire vigil with continuous prayer. A sign-up sheet has been placed on the bulletin board next to the Nursery. Consider taking 15 minutes of your time to participate in this Vigil and let your prayer rise like incense!

## CROP WALK OCTOBER 3, 2004

**The 33rd ANNUAL CROP WALK FOR HUNGER** will be held October 3, 2004 at 2:00 p.m. in Muscatine. It will start again at First National Bank's underground parking lot for only a 5K walk this year. The walk will be held on the river walk with a break at Musser Park if needed and then return to the bank.

This is an excellent way to help stop hunger worldwide through Church World Service and locally, since 25% of all proceeds will stay at the Muscatine Community Food Pantry. Once again this year, E & M Charities, now the New Hope Foundation, will be matching the pledges obtained by the walkers. This means the amount obtained by each walker in pledges will be doubled!

Last year, the Muscatine CROP WALK contributed over \$35,000 (including the matching grant). Zion contributed around \$2000 and with matching funds that came to \$4000 with \$1000 staying in Muscatine. This ends up being the largest fund raiser for the food pantry. What a great response from our Congregation last year. Let's continue to show we care.

Sign up to walk or pledge after the Worship Services on September 19 or 26 or call Nancy Tietge at 263-0032. Pledges need to be in and envelopes returned to Nancy or other designee at either Worship Service or before the walk on Sunday, October 3. Sign up to walk as an individual, family, pal, or group, but sign up to walk and support this needy cause.

Why do we do this? 20% of the world's population lives in absolute poverty with incomes of less than a dollar a day. People are still starving. One U.S. child in five lives in poverty. We can't help ALL, but we can do SOMETHING. Remember, we will be helping some of the hungry in Muscatine County by putting money in the Muscatine Food Pantry and this is important for helping our own neighbors in Muscatine.

Please join us walking or pledge what you can.

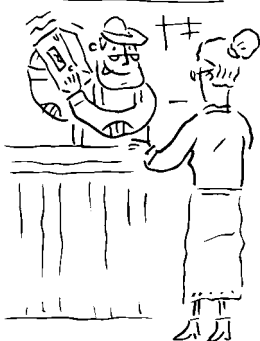

## Zion's New Website

Zion now has entered into the information age – at least in part. We now have a website to call our own. <http://www.zionmuscatine.org> was developed through a collaborative effort by Alan Lange and myself, with lots of input and support from others including Pastor Paul and Cheryl. If you haven't looked at it yet, please take the time to visit and browse around. I believe you will like what you see. If you don't have Internet access and would like to see the site, stop by the church office and ask one of the staff to give you a tour. This site continues to be a work-in-progress and will remain so as we identify our congregation's place in the World Wide Web.

When you access the site, you will immediately recognize it as Zion's home page with the church building prominently displayed in the center. On either side of the picture is our address, telephone, and other information that a visitor would want to see. Also included is a link to an online map of the church location.

This site is designed to be easy to navigate. There is a menu on the lower left of each page, which will point you to additional pages. On the home page is an area displaying the next 7 days' calendar of Events, along with various ELCA links.

As you browse the website, please take note of the church calendar. In addition to a weekly schedule of events on the home page, there is also a link, found in the left-hand menu, to a full year calendar. This is the same calendar as the one printed in your "Contact". From time to time, there will be featured events noted at the top of the calendar. In addition to the standard monthly calendar, there are a number of viewing and search options. It is an extremely versatile calendar and one to be referred to regularly.

Speaking of the "Contact", your newsletter is now available online – not only the current issue, but also previous issues for you to refer to. You will need a copy of Adobe Reader to view it, but directions for downloading it are displayed on the page.

There are currently photos from four prior events available for viewing. Hopefully this area will grow as time and photos allow.

Lastly, when you have had enough of the serious side of the church, click on the link marked "Just for fun". Here you will find a number of links devoted to the "lighter" side of Lutheranism – all poking gentle fun at ourselves, and well worth the visit.

Before leaving the website, please take the time to sign the Guestbook. The link is located at the bottom of the home page.

As stated previously, this site is our site, and still a work-in-progress. Some of the pages are still under construction. Future enhancements may include sub-domains for various groups within our congregation such as a site maintained solely by the Youth Committee. 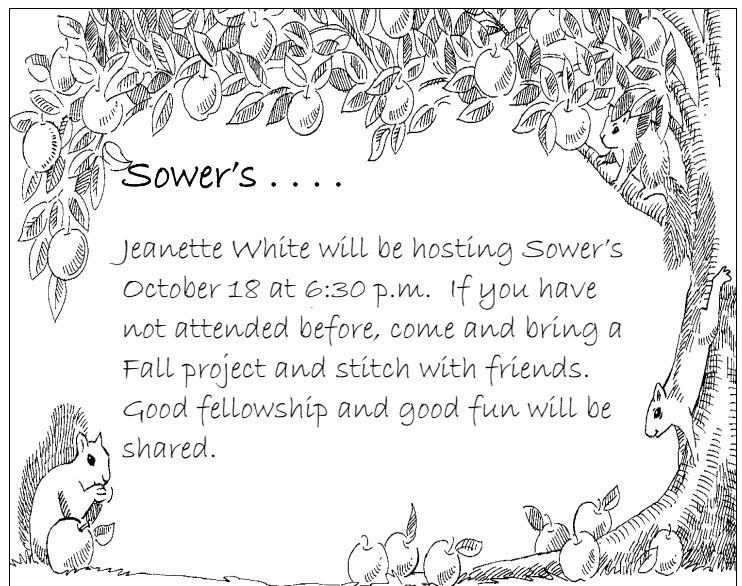

## **WANTED CELL PHONES & PRINTER CARTRIDGES**

LSI is excited to announce a new fund-raising program! Starting immediately, we will be collecting and recycling used cell phones and ink jet and laser printer cartridges. When turned in to a recycling company, LSI will be paid \$1-\$25 per cell phone and \$0.50-\$10 per cartridge. This may not sound like much, but think of the number of cell phones and cartridges replaced every year by everyone you know.

It is estimated that Americans will soon be disposing of 130 million cell phones **every year**. That's about 65,000 tons. About 30 million unused cell phones are lying around homes right now. As for cartridges, every year 300 million cartridges are thrown away, which equals the weight of 30,500 African elephants. Most of these cell phones and cartridges are ending up in landfills.

At Zion, we will have a box on the lower level by the office into which these items may be placed. We will get them to the LSI office and they will be responsible for forwarding them to the Ames office where they will be sent to the appropriate places.



## FROM THE TRUST FUND

The Zion Lutheran Church Trust Fund will be awarding **two \$750 scholarships** to college students from Zion this year. Since 1991, twenty-two scholarships have been awarded to members of this congregation. Applicants must be full-time students at an accredited college or university, have completed at least one semester of study, and have been members at Zion for at least two years. Applications are available in the church office or may be requested by e-mail and must be **returned to the church office by November 8.**

The mission outreach fund in the Zion Trust Fund will be awarding two grants of at least \$500 each in December supporting ministries outside of Zion. Possible recipients include but are not limited to camps, campus ministries, human service agencies, institutions of the church, and other organizations that meet the human and spiritual needs of people. The Trust Fund Committee is inviting the people of Zion **to make nominations or suggestions for grant considerations** this year. One of the grants must have a local Muscatine connection, and one must be connected in some way with the ELCA. Contact the church office or use the bulletin "tear-off" form which will be appearing in future weeks to make suggestions and nominations. We ask that this be done by **October 15** in order to facilitate the review and selection process.
